Ralph was a 1942 graduate of Jamestown High School. Following graduation, he attended Fenn College in Cleveland, Ohio, before enlisting in the U.S. Navy. He served during World War II in the Pacific Theater and was a plank owner (original crew member) aboard the Destroyer Escort USS Weaver D.E. 741. The ship and its crew received 10 battle stars and experienced two typhoons. He was discharged in February 1946, as a motor machinist mate first class.

Following his discharge from the service, Ralph joined the family business, Jamestown Blower Co. and retired as president in 1979, when the company was sold.

Confirmed in the class of 1939, he was a member of First Lutheran Church, where he had served on the Board of Trustees.

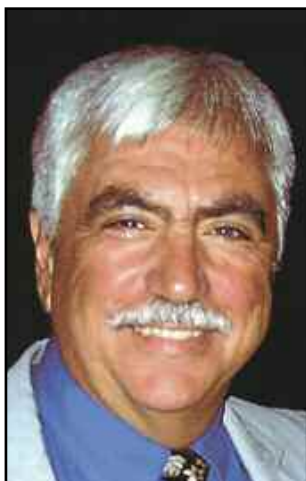
